Enrollments

Bachelor’s Degree in Modern Foreign Languages and Literatures (LLSM)

From July 1 to October 2, 2026

Students must take the [TOLC-SU](#) by September 25, 2026 – registration for the online test must be completed on the [CISIA](#) portal by the deadline set by CISIA (approximately 7 days before the test date).

Students enrolled in the LLSM program who fail to achieve the minimum score in the ‘Text comprehension and knowledge of the Italian language’ section of the TOLC-SU (or who fail to take the test altogether) will be assigned an [OFA](#) (an acronym for Additional Learning Requirement) in Italian. This requirement must be fulfilled by September 30, 2027; otherwise, the student will not be allowed to enroll in the second year.

The OFA in Italian (course code 13049) will be verified through a computerized test. Three exam sessions are scheduled: January, late May/early June, and late August/early September 2027. The OFA must be completed BEFORE taking the exams in ‘Italian Language’ and ‘Italian Literature/Contemporary Italian Literature’.



Late Enrollment

From October 3 to November 13, 2026

Students must take the [TOLC-SU](#) by November 19, 2026.

Master's Degree Programs (Open Access)

A single time window is established for the entire process (pre-enrollment and enrollment), **from April 1 to November 13, 2026**

Applicants may pre-enroll in up to two master's degree programs by paying the required pre-enrollment fee for each program. Applications (online application + payment) will be reviewed by the admissions committee according to the following schedule, so that students may enroll by October 21, 2024:

Enrollment in Single Courses

Applications for enrollment in single courses must be submitted between August 3, 2026 and July 15, 2027.

Before lectures begin, the Department offers 60-hour courses for absolute beginners in the following foreign languages (students can only enroll in one course):

Beginner Courses – 60 hours

From September 14 to October 2, 2026:

- Arabic – 1 group
- Chinese – 1 group
- French – 1 group (also open to students from the Department of Humanities, Philosophy, and Communication)
- Japanese – 1 group
- Russian – 1 group
- Spanish – 1 group (also open to students from the Department of Humanities, Philosophy, and Communication)
- German – 1 group (also open to students from the Department of Humanities,



Philosophy, and Communication)

Eligibility: completion of enrollment in the degree program and online registration. Students with insufficient [Placement test](#) scores in a foreign language are strongly encouraged to attend the Beginner Courses (French, Spanish, German) or, in the case of English, the Remedial Work course.

Examination Calendar

N.B. Students intending to graduate in the summer session must complete all required exams within the established deadlines (cf. next sections)



End of First Semester: one exam session reserved exclusively for international mobility students (excluding Foreign Language exams, cf. CdD decision of 11.12.2012).

January 8 – February 13, 2027

- **All subjects (including Foreign Languages):** two exam sessions (minimum 14 days apart)
- **Italian Language:** one session in January

May 24 – July 31, 2027 (excluding graduation days, July 8–9)

- **All subjects except Foreign Languages:** three sessions (minimum 14 days apart)
- **Foreign Languages:** two sessions (minimum 2 weeks apart)
- For the 3rd year of the Bachelor's Degree and 2nd year of Master's Degree programs, the first oral exam must take place before June 26, 2027 (deadline for graduation eligibility)
- **Italian Language:** two sessions

August 16 – September 18, 2027

- **All subjects except Foreign Languages:** two sessions (minimum 14 days apart)

Certifications obtained by the students are recognized by the Department within 24 months from the certificate's issue date, and are assessed at the first available Course Council meeting.

Verification of Initial Preparation for Master's Degrees

The methods, times, and classrooms for admission interviews are indicated in each [Master's Degree Program's](#) website.

Pre-enrolled students deemed adequately prepared must enroll and pay the regional tax for the Right to Education and the virtual stamp duty, totaling €156. Students not yet graduated will be conditionally admitted, provided they graduate by the extraordinary March-April 2026 session.

Those failing to graduate by then who attended Master's Degree courses may take the relative exams after graduation, by registering as single-course students (without additional costs for Unibg graduates).

Study Plan Deadlines a.y. 2025-2026

Students must choose a curriculum upon enrollment and may change it until the study plan submission deadline.

- **Bachelor's Degree programs and 2nd year of Master's Degrees:** October 14 – November 16, 2026
- **1st year of Master's Degree programs (including conditionally admitted students):** October 28 – November 20, 2026
